3B	Reading	Grade 3-5	2	Social and Instructional	Student can use visually supported context to derive meaning and facilitate fluency. Student can use prior knowledge to make predictions.
4B	Writing	Grade 3-5	2	Social and Instructional	Student can describe pictures of unsafe practices around school, home, or community (such as pedestrian safety)
5B	Listening	Grade 3-5	2	Language Arts	Student is able to respond to teachers' reading of illustrated stories or trade books by following directions (such as creating word families or word walls.)
6B	Speaking	Grade 3-5	2	Language Arts	Student is able to compare self with other familiar persons (such as friends, family members, or movie stars)
7B	Reading	Grade 3-5	2	Language Arts	Student can follow language patterns from predictable, illustrated trade books (such as repetitive phrases)
8B	Writing	Grade 3-5	2	Language Arts	Student uses models to create phrases as personal reminders (such as homework assignments)
9B	Listening	Grade 3-5	2	Math	Student can compare prices (using visually supported newspaper ads) from oral questions (e.g., "Which one costs more, X or X?")
10B	Speaking	Grade 3-5	2	Math	Student can rephrase new information about math processes involving computation with use of visual support.
11B	Reading	Grade 3-5	2	Math	Student is able to construct or recognize scale drawings from models and written directions.
12B	Writing	Grade 3-5	2	Math	Student can show the process of problem solving through drawings and sequential language (e.g., "First . . .Second . . .")
13B	Listening	Grade 3-5	2	Science	Student can select or draw healthy choices for meals or lifestyles from realia, magazines, or newspapers following oral directions.
14B	Speaking	Grade 3-5	2	Science	Student can classify or give examples of organisms or types of systems depicted visually.
15B	Reading	Grade 3-5	2	Science	Student can find ways to conserve water and energy from pictures and written text (e.g., "Stop leaving lights on." "Stop leaving the shower on.")
16B	Writing	Grade 3-5	2	Science	Student is able to draw pictures and note observations of scientific method.

17B	Listening	Grade 3-5	2	Social Studies	Student can identify prehistoric animals or tools from pictures and oral descriptions (e.g., "This animal was taller than a 5 story building.")
18B	Speaking	Grade 3-5	2	Social Studies	Student can describe locations of places on maps (e.g., "Wisconsin is between Minnesota and Michigan.")
19B	Reading	Grade 3-5	2	Social Studies	Student can compare immigration or migration routes based on globes or maps (e.g., "Asia is farther from the U.S. than Mexico.")
20B	Writing	Grade 3-5	2	Social Studies	Student can produce entries for historical journals from timelines or visually supported newspaper headlines.
